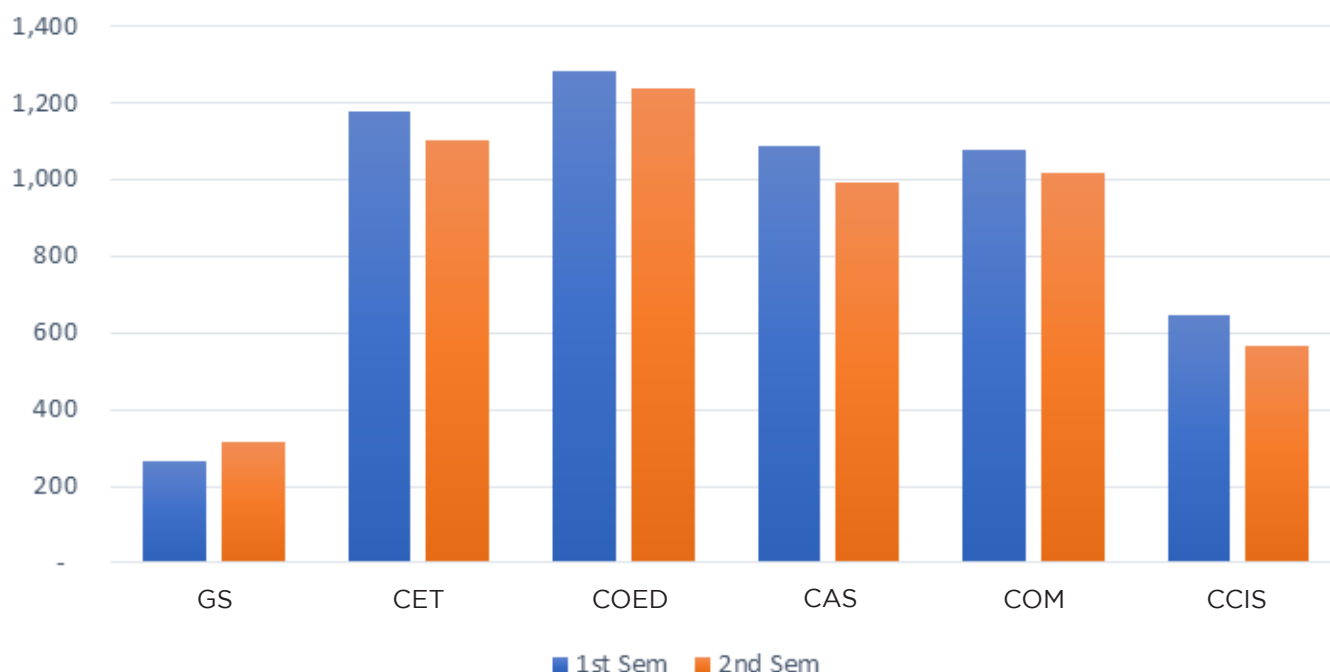
Enrolment Profile

Enrolment

The University has served a total of **5,525 students** during the First Semester of AY 2020-2021. In the following semester, there were **5,251** students that enrolled, **4.96%** lower than the number of enrollees during the previous semester. Majority of the students were from the **College of Education (23.17%)**, followed by the **College of Engineering and Technology (21.27%)** then the **College of Management (17.03%)**, and the **College of Arts and Sciences (19.66%)**.

Last March 19, 2021, due to the adoption of BOR Resolution No. 09, s. 2021 (creation and renaming of colleges and realignment of undergraduate programs), the student enrollment rate for the summer term has been affected. Hence, for the summer term, a total of 940 students enrolled. Majority of the students were from the **College of Agriculture and Technology 44.89%**, followed by the **College of Engineering and Architecture (35.85%)**.

1ST AND 2ND SEMESTER, SY 2020-2021**

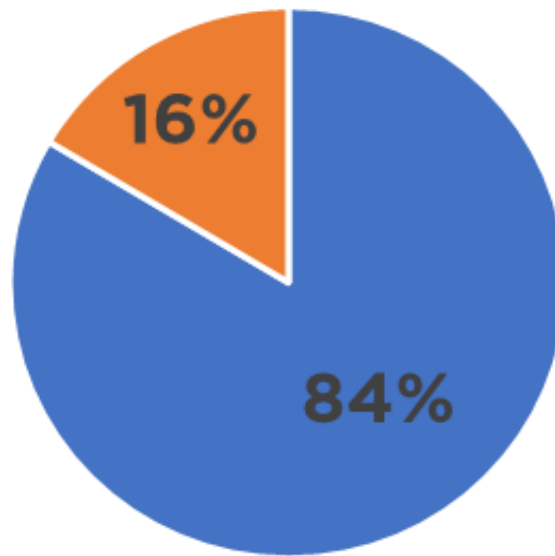


CHED-RDC Identified Priority Programs Offered in the University

As per record, 84% of the total program offerings of the university are compliant with CHED-RDC Identified Priority Programs.

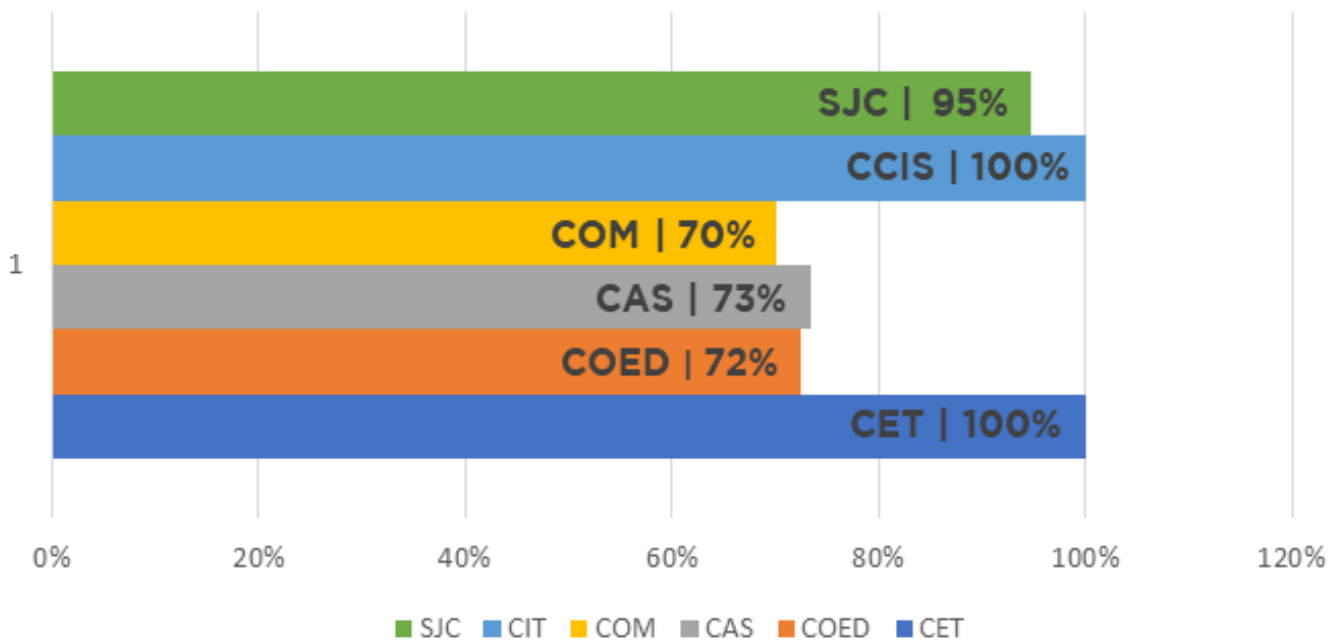

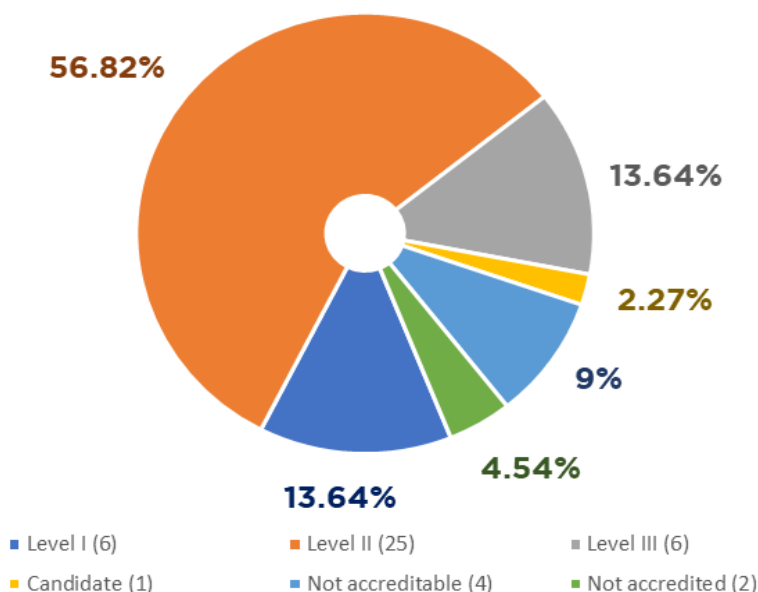

DISTRIBUTION OF PROGRAMS' ACCREDITATION STATUS



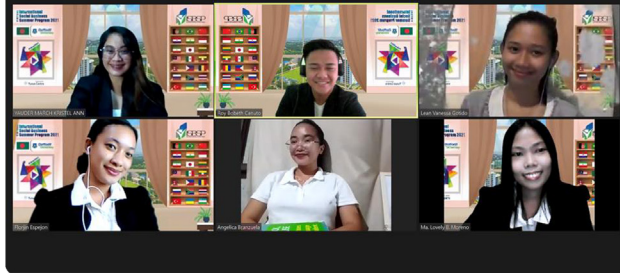
Internationalization

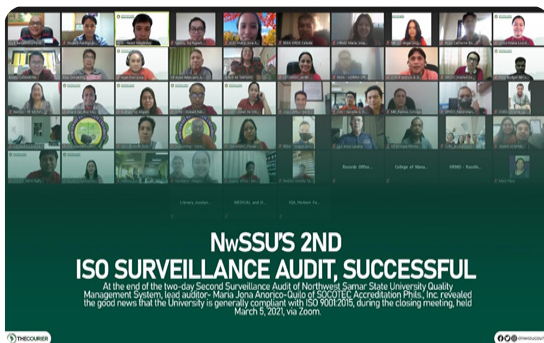
The College of Criminal Justice and Sciences conducted its own Capability Building to recapacitate its faculty members on NwSSU policies and targets.

The Office of Research Development Services (ORDS) remains steadfast in ensuring that the university's research priorities are met. Despite the numerous challenges posed by the current pandemic, the university, through its faculty researchers and ORDS, was able to exceed expectations by engaging in high-quality research outputs and producing credible results responsive to the needs of its stakeholders. In fact, two researches for Santa Margarita and Calbayog City Local Government Units were used to support COVID 19 monitoring and forecasting. Over 16 research outputs were completed within the year and approximately 43% of the outputs from faculty research were published in either internationally peer-reviewed journals or CHED-accredited journals.

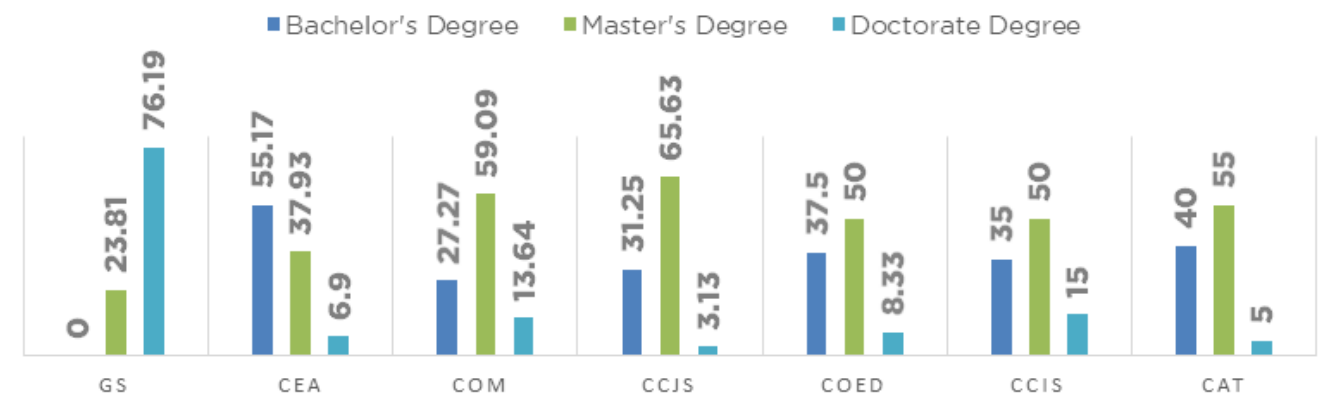
As of December 2021, the Main Campus has maintained **170** teaching and **52** non-teaching personnel. Out of 170 teaching personnel, **126 (80.42%)** are on permanent status and **44 (19.58%)** are on temporary status. On the other hand, out of the 52 non-teaching personnel, **50 (96.23%)** are on permanent status and **2 (3.77%)** are casual employees.

Educational Qualification of Teaching and Non-Teaching Personnel

From among the **170** faculty in the main campus of the University, **29 (17.059%)** are Doctorate degree holders, **82 (48.235%)** are Master's degree holders while **38 (34.706%)** are still Bachelor's degree holders. However, majority of these faculty who are Bachelor's degree holders are already in the finishing stage of their Master's program. On the other hand, **1 (1.92%)** of the non-teaching staff is a Doctorate degree holder, **2 (3.85%)** are Master's degree holders, **36 (69.23%)** are Bachelor's degree holders, **4 (7.69%)** reached Tertiary level, **3 (5.77%)** earned Vocational Courses and **6 (11.54%)** finished Elementary & High School.



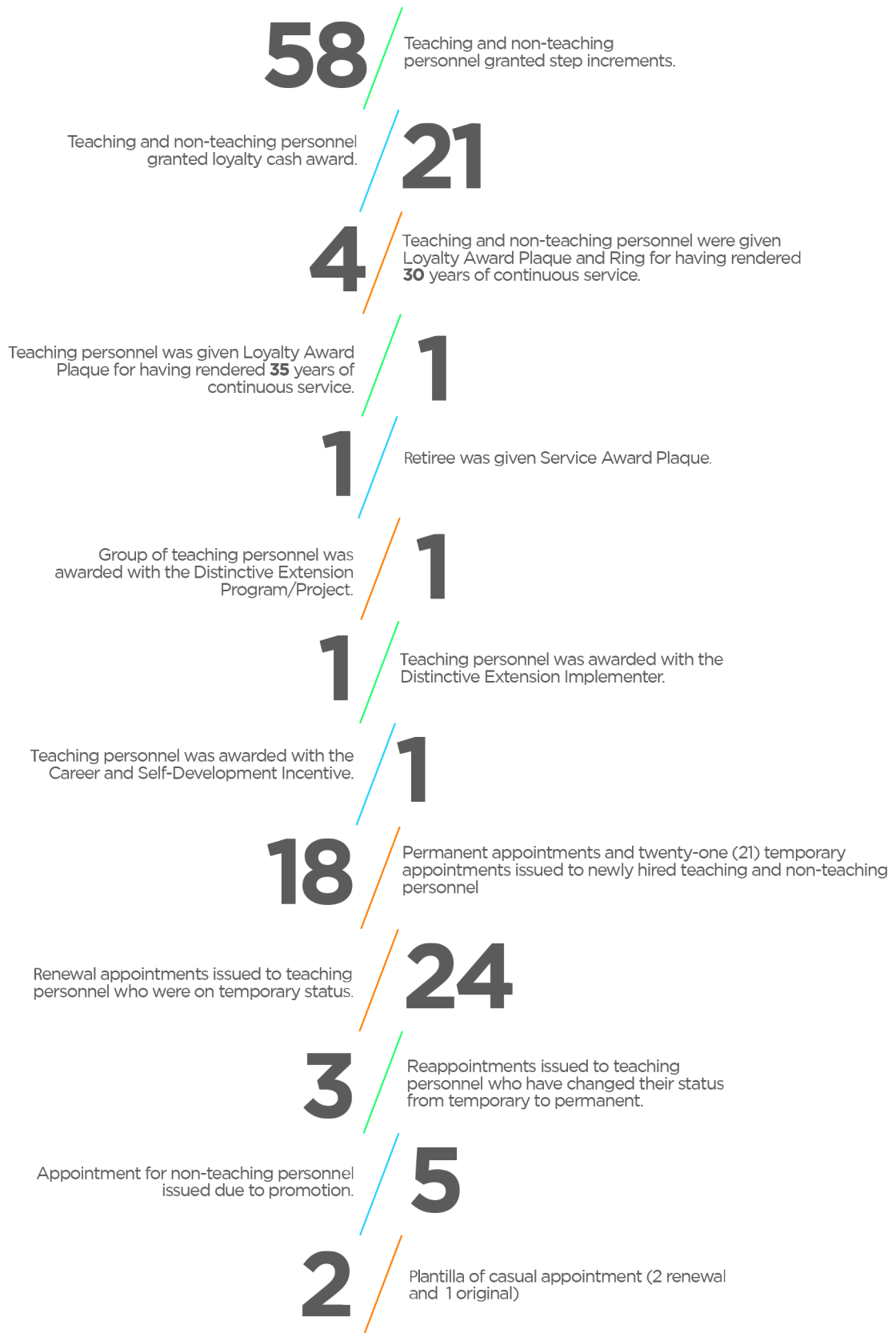
Educational Qualification by Department

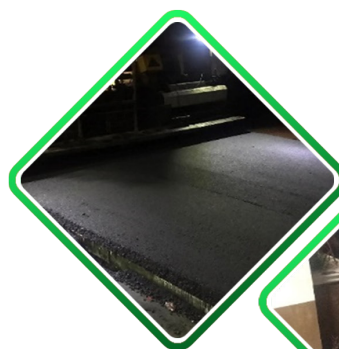

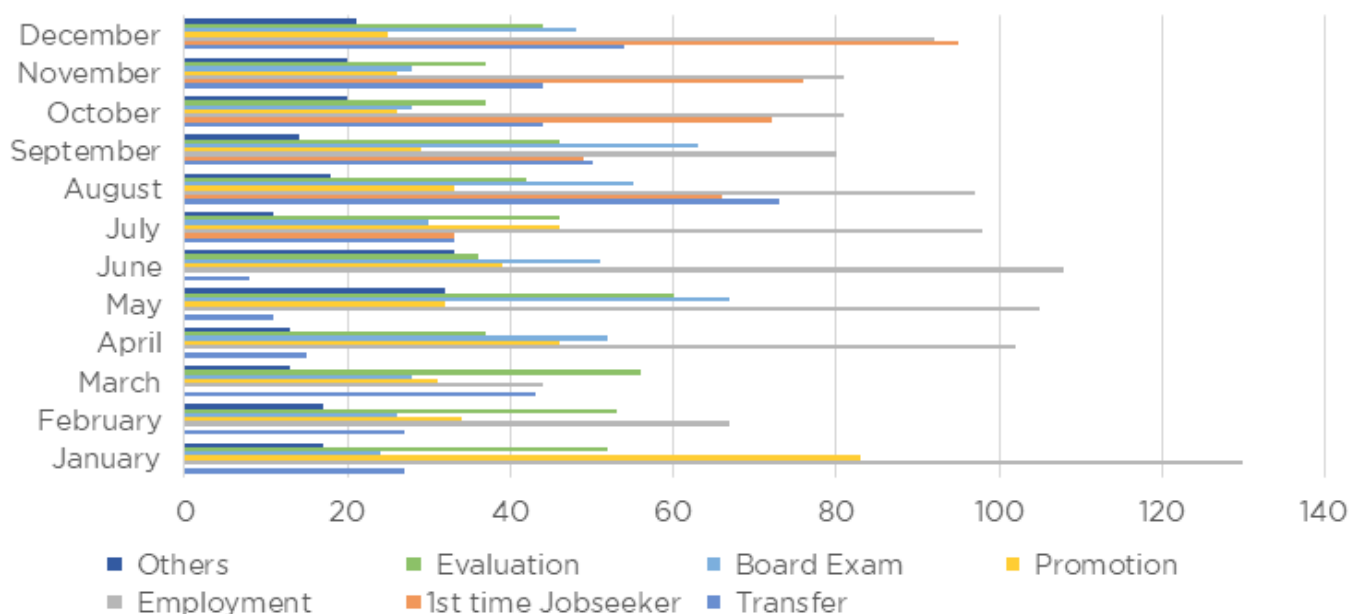




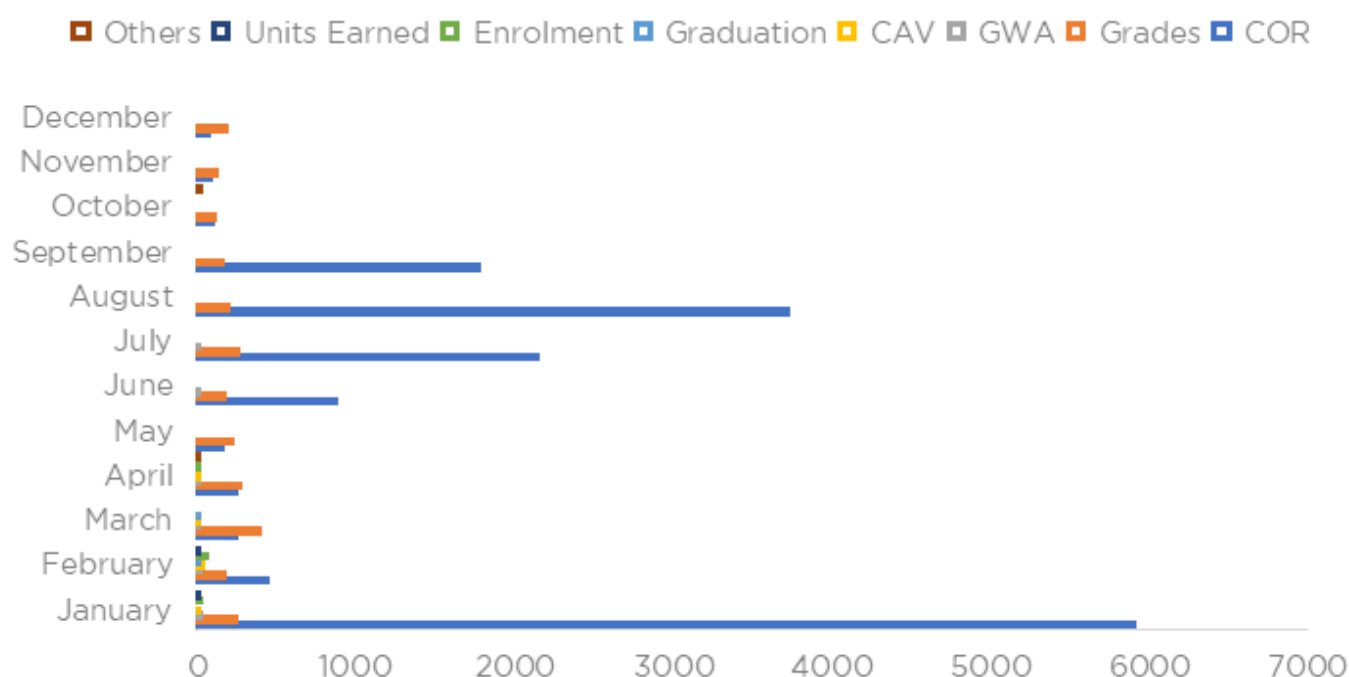
Registrar's Services

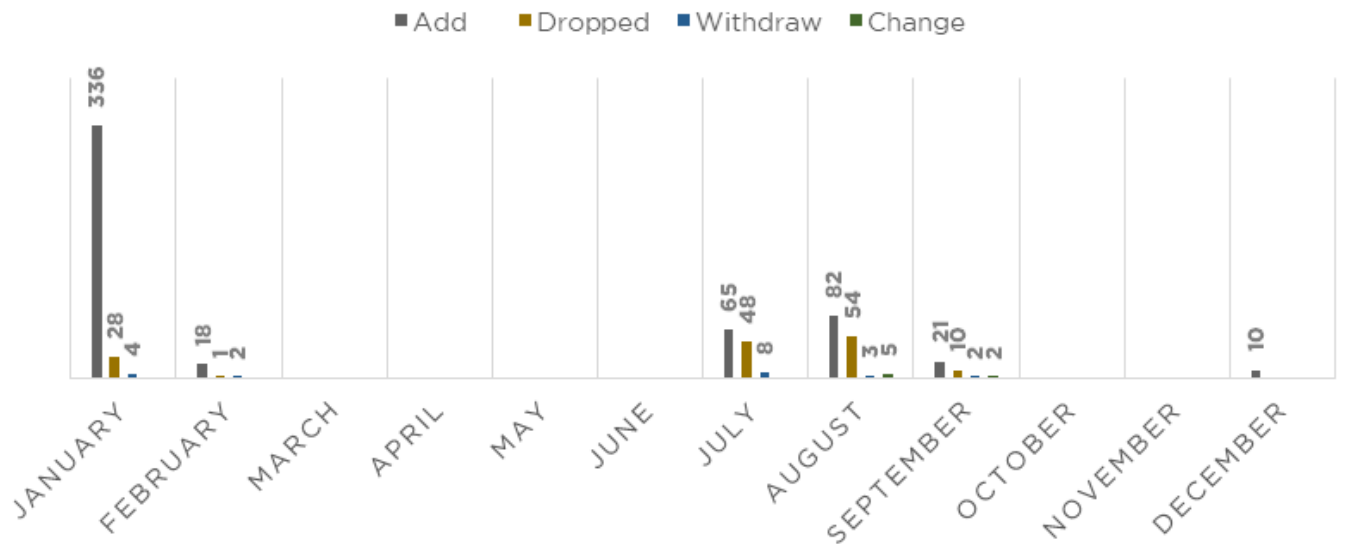
REQUEST FOR TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS FOR SY 2020-2021



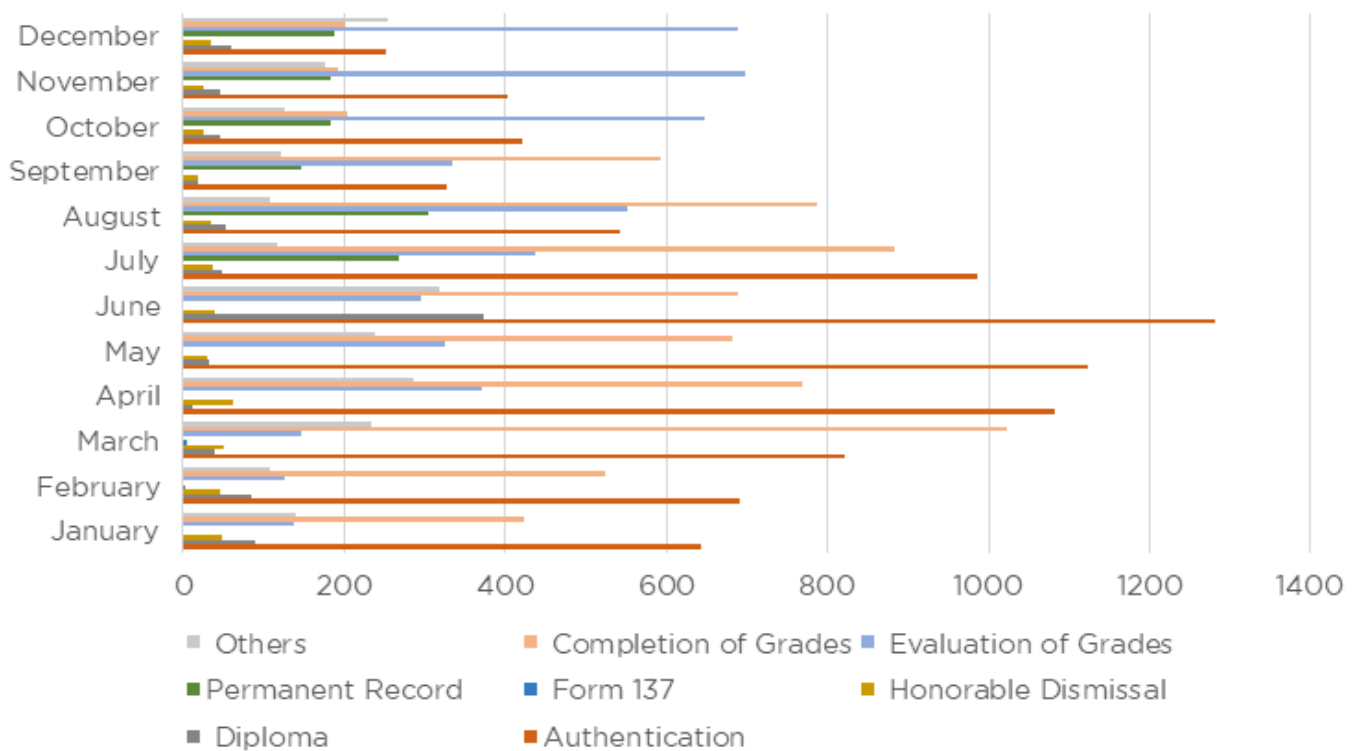
REQUESTS FOR CERTIFICATE OF GRADES FOR SY 2020-2021

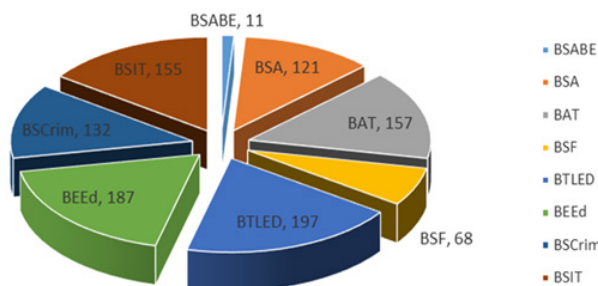

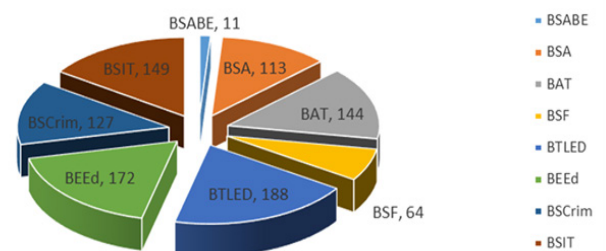

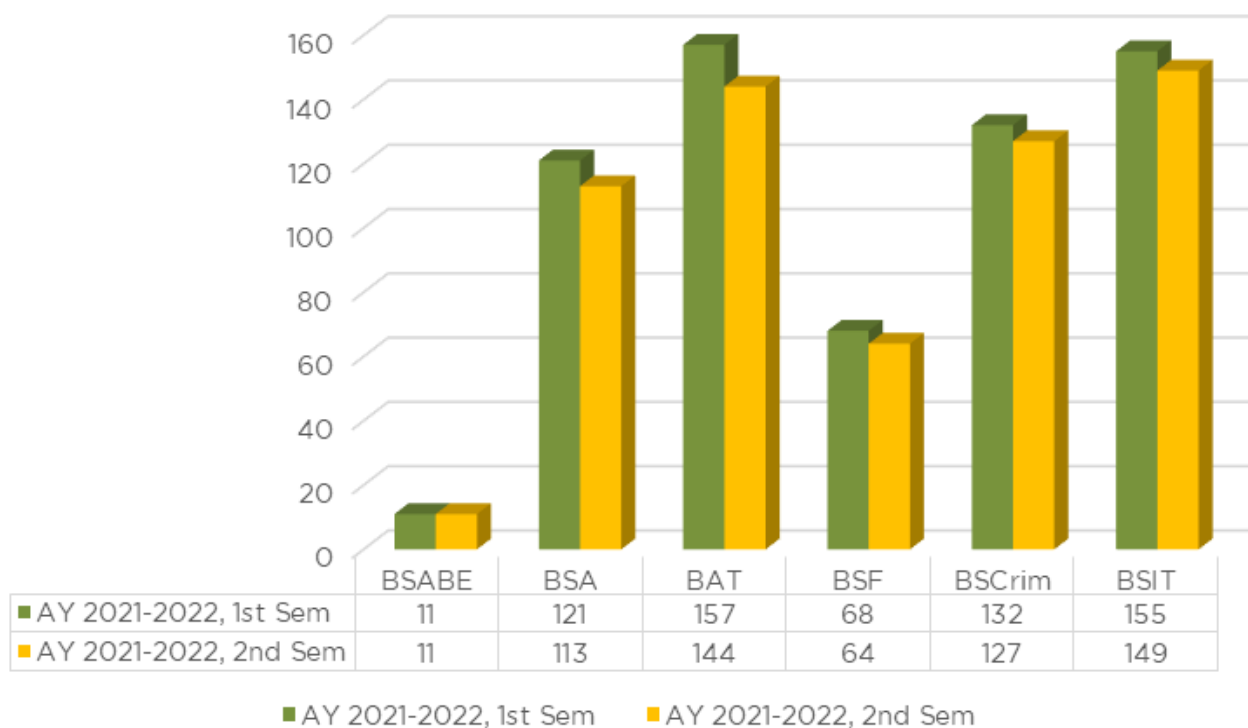
Enrolment Distribution Per Program
AY 2021-2022, First Semester



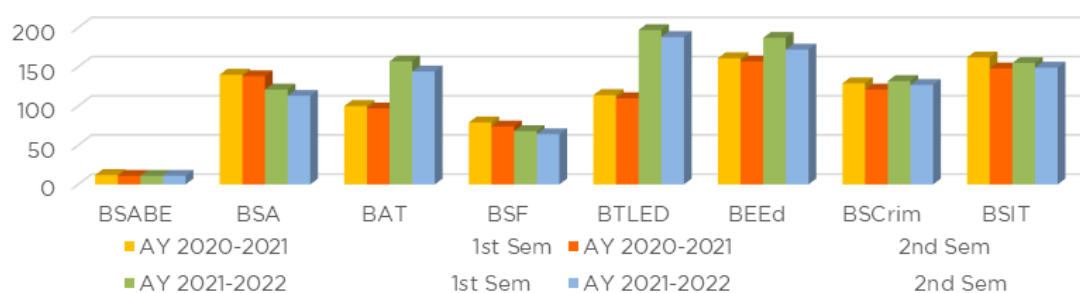
Enrolment Distribution Per Program

A.Y. 2020 - 2021 and A.Y. 2021 - 2022

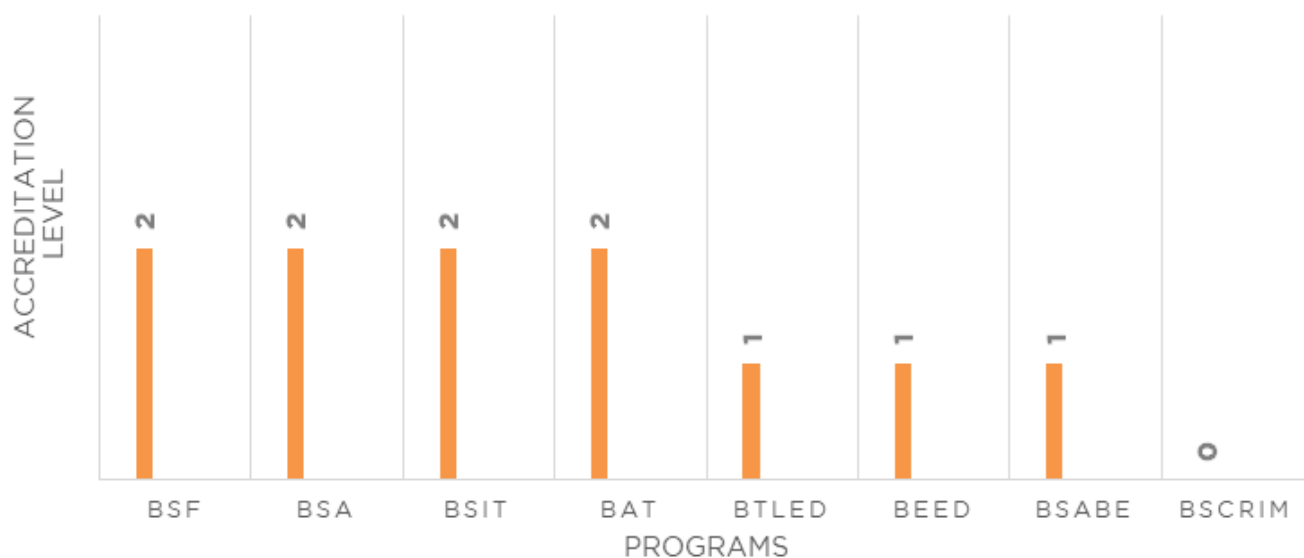

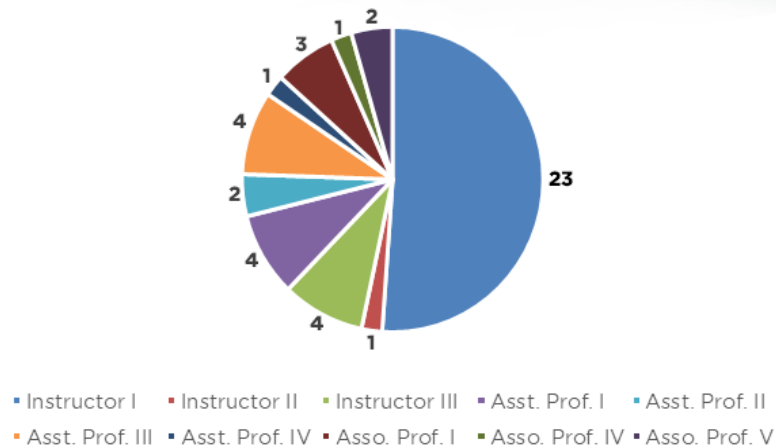

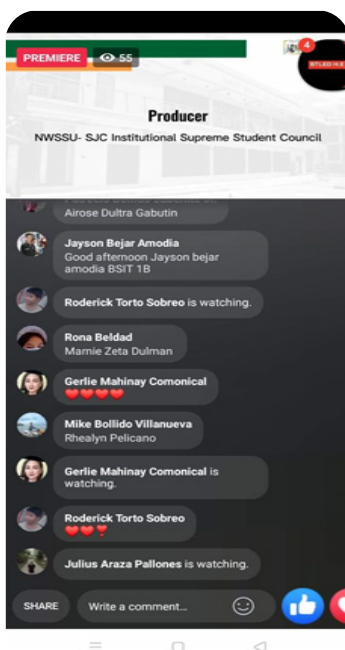

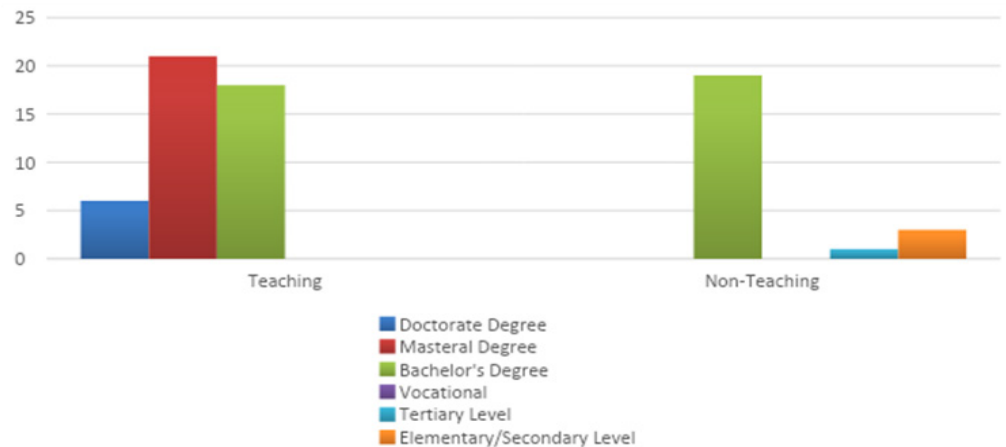

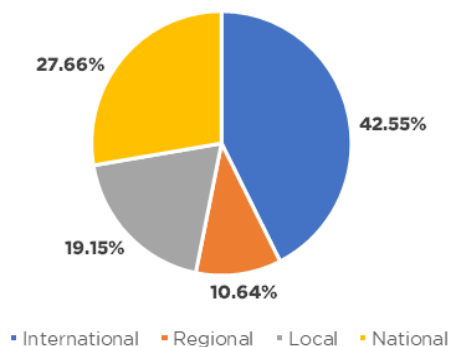
As of December 2021, the NwSSU - San Jorge Campus has maintained 45 teaching and 28 non-teaching personnel. Out of the 45 teaching personnel, 31 are on permanent status and 14 are on temporary status. On the other hand, out of 28 non-teaching personnel, 25 have permanent status and 3 are on casual status. The graph below presents the data of the teaching and non-teaching personnel with the corresponding statuses.

Educational Qualification of Teaching and Non-Teaching Personnel

As of December 2021, twenty-one (21) out of 45 teaching personnel hold master's degrees, in their respective discipline, eighteen (18) faculty have their bachelors degree but are now earning units for the master's degree, and six (6) faculty are already doctorate. On the other hand, majority of the non-teaching personnel are bachelor's degree holders (24),

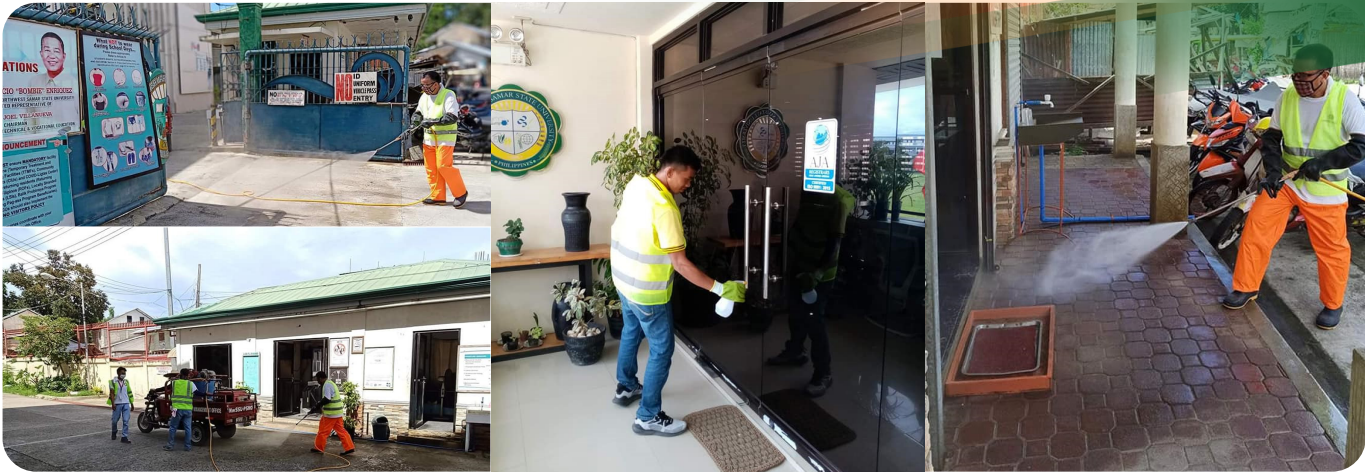


NwSSU employees were provided free shuttle rides to and from the University due to strict travel implementation.
